APPENDIX A

Extract from letter of invitation from the Right Honourable R. G. Menzies, C.H., Q.C., M.P., Prime Minister of Australia, to Sir Keith Murray, Chairman of the University Grants Committee in Great Britain (19th December, 1956).

“As foreshadowed in our discussions in London, I have great pleasure in inviting you to head a Committee of Inquiry into the future of the Australian Universities. We would hope that the Committee would take a wide charter to investigate how best the Universities may serve Australia at a time of great social and economic development within the nation.

The Committee is invited to indicate ways in which the Universities might be organised so as to ensure that their long-term pattern of development is in the best interests of the nation, and in particular to inquire into such matters as:—

- (1) the role of the University in the Australian community;
- (2) the extension and co-ordination of University facilities;
- (3) technological education at University level; and
- (4) the financial needs of Universities and appropriate means of providing for these needs.

This list is not meant to be exhaustive and it does not set out to limit the inquiry to be undertaken by the Committee. I recognise that in the space of three months the Committee will of necessity be forced to limit its inquiries and deliberations to a relatively small number of topics. One of its first tasks therefore will be to specify the areas for consideration keeping in mind the general terms of reference outlined above.

In brief I have in mind that the Committee might pay attention to what Australian Universities could reasonably be expected to do, how they might be organised to do this and how their activities should be financed. Some of the specific topics which interest me include: numbers which should be kept in mind in determining whether a new University ought to be established, machinery for ensuring that the creation of new Faculties and Chairs is done in such a way that existing resources are used adequately and needless duplication does not occur, and an analysis of the adequacy of the Commonwealth Scholarship Scheme whereby some 3,000 new scholarships are available annually for students at tertiary institutions. These, of course, represent only a few of the large number of topics which could be listed, but I would prefer the Committee itself to retain a considerable measure of freedom in deciding which problems might be studied in detail to give the most useful type of advice.”

(i) The Hostel also provided accommodation for 56 students enrolled at other institutions.

(ii) These two Colleges are now under construction. There are at present 24 residences, six in the university area and the others scattered throughout Armidale. They are either owned or leased by the University. The number of full-time students in residence in 1956 was 278. On completion Mary White College will accommodate 100 students and Wright College, 180.

(iii) Opened 1957, full-time enrolment: 42.

(iv) The College does not conduct any residential colleges on its own account. It has an arrangement, however, for nominating residents to Narellan House, a Government Hostel. No full-time students were in residence in 1956.
